Ralph enabled us to explore the infinite. We intellectually learned about the plant medicines, the molecules, and plant's ability to teach us; however, Ralph knew that intellectual knowledge was not enough. So he led us to the precipice—an invitation to jump. That leap off the cliff remained our responsibility, while Ralph had our backs, holding the space for us.
